# Theme 1 – Finance & Resource Gaps

# Challenges

- Short-term, fragmented funding leads to instability.
- Resource limitations impact staffing, training, and infrastructure.
- Complex, competitive funding models disadvantage smaller organisations.

- Advocating for diversity of options available (courses and drops-ins).
- Multi-year funding models.
- Strengthening partnerships for consortium of services and funding.



# Theme 2 – Skills, Support & Training Needs

### Challenges

- Lack of standardised training and accreditation.
- Knowledge gaps in mental health and physical conditions, safeguarding, and health system.
- Limited linkage with health practitioners.
- Limited access to affordable professional development.

- Creating accredited, affordable training programs.
- Expanding trauma-informed and complex social and health needs knowledge.
- Mentorship and peer learning networks.
- Reflective practice supervision with a trained health and or social care practitioner worker.



# Theme 3 – Perceptions within Nature Sector

# Challenges

- Diversity of perspectives regarding green social prescribing definitions.
- Limited visibility of nature-based social prescribing.
- Limited professional development and career pathways for nature practitioners.

- Establishing a recognised professional workforce framework for nature-based social prescribing.
- Cross-sector and cross-partnership multidisciplinary team working.
- Developing clear career pathways and progression routes.



# Theme 4 – Integration with Health & Care Systems

### Challenges

- Limited engagement between naturebased practitioners and health & care system based social prescribers
- Limited understanding of nature-based social prescribing offers within health and social care.
- High turn-over of practitioners or link workers limiting trusted relationships and mutual understanding of offers.

- Enhancing awareness and education for health and social care professionals.
- Creating structured referral pathways and ongoing participant support.
- Cross-sector and cross-partnership multidisciplinary team and system working.



The national cross-government GSP partnership is developing materials and resources to support spread and scale of nature-based social prescribing






Surrey's approach to integrating nature into system activity

# **GSP** Core





In Surrey we aim to achieve a range of cross-functional benefits across climate change, health and economic growth by:

Using our position as a WorkWell (DWP) pilot site, to model the use of fit notes as a universal trigger to identify adults who may be at risk of declining health and wellbeing and offering nature-based interventions support to return to work.

Using our green social prescribing developments to increase **biodiversity** and modelling how we could **capture carbon offset through green health and wellbeing** spaces, so as to support the NHS Net Zero and greener future ambitions.


Using our Accelerator Reform Funding (DHSC) to model the use of social prescribing, including green opportunities, for at risk adult populations including those in touch with the probation service, and those frequently attending A&E for non-critical health needs.

Using **GSP** funding to support young people experiencing EBSA to access horticultural training opportunities, increasing their employability and **developing the skills we need to support our green economy**.

Working with our local authority contracts and the **social value** offered to secure **business support for green health and wellbeing** interventions e.g. a business-led green health and wellbeing roundtable to co-design their contribution.

Using IPSPC and Connect to Work to promote diverse recruitment into green economy roles, increasing representation within the environmental sector, and nature-based health and wellbeing interventions we're providing.

Underpinned by cross-functional, cost-benefit evaluation
