5th International Social Prescribing Network Research Conference, 19th & 20th June, the University of Westminster, London, England

Innovation and innovative practices in social prescribing.

Our objective is to spotlight pioneering approaches, both nationally and internationally, with a focus on impact and tackling health inequalities.

This conference is open to delegates who are:

- Involved in any element of commissioning, implementing or delivering social prescribing activity.
- Interested in routine monitoring of outcomes of social prescribing.
- Actively undertaking research and evaluation in social prescribing.

We welcome submissions that address the theoretical perspectives of social prescribing, systematic reviews, research studies (quantitative or qualitative), independent evaluations, analysis of secondary data as well as original reports of evaluations that are carried out by organisations.

We also welcome abstracts that address the continuous learning from implementing a social prescribing scheme as well as research and evaluation on the different types of impact of social prescribing schemes.

Submissions could take the form of joint oral presentations at panel sessions to facilitate the perspectives of different stakeholders.

Abstracts can be submitted for an oral presentation or a poster. In the event of there being more demand for oral slots than the programme allows, applicants may be offered a poster session.

Please ensure that permission to present the data has been put in place before submitting your abstract and that all data sharing adheres to the Data Protection Act 1998 and the General Data Protection Regulation.

We anticipate notifying you about your abstract submission by the **23rd May 2024** or thereabouts.

Please note that abstract submission is highly competitive. If your submission is unsuccessful, we would like to support your networking opportunities so that you can share your work. ALL applicants will be offered the opportunity to publish their abstract and contact details in the conference review after the event on the NASP and The Social Prescribing Network websites.
